

Occupational therapists are registered health practitioners who work with people to improve their health and wellbeing, with a focus on physical and mental health that may be related to a person's injury or illness, or to an accident or developmental impairment. The primary goal of occupational therapy is to enable people to participate in everyday life.


To gain registration as an occupational therapist, practitioners must complete a minimum four-year undergraduate, or two-year postgraduate Master program of study approved by the Occupational Therapy Board of Australia

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
### Figure 1: Occupational Therapists: Workforce status, 2019

# Quick Facts - 2019

Quick facts for Occupational Therapists







Between 2015 and 2019, the total number of Occupational Therapists with general or limited registration increased by 31.0% from 17,929 to 23,480 (a compound annual growth rate of 7.0%). The number of employed Occupational Therapists ('workforce') increased 33.2% from 15,022 to 20,016 over the same period (a compound annual growth rate of 7.4%).

The number of employed Occupational Therapists who worked as clinicians increased 34.1% from 13,298 to 17,836 over the same period (a compound annual growth rate of 7.6%). Clinicians are Occupational Therapists who indicated that the principal role of their main job was clinician (including managers and supervisors also providing clinical services). Non-clinicians are Occupational Therapists who indicated that the principal role of their main job was administrator (including managers not providing clinical services), teacher, educator, research or other.

The following analysis of the Occupational Therapy 'workforce' is drawn from the number of the Occupational therapist with general or limited registration who were employed (20,016 in 2019 as indicated by blue shading in figure 1) unless otherwise stated.

### Figure 2: Gender distribution, 2015-2019




